

## Mother's Day Sermon: Love as the Foundation

Despite the challenges of raising such a large family, she dedicated one hour each week with each of her children, teaching them scripture, praying with them, and encouraging their faith. Her love, patience, and devotion left a legacy of faith that changed the world. This is what a mother's love can do—it can transform lives and ignite generations of faith.
